1. Discernment Checklist for Your Church

A. Symbols & Architecture

- Square & compass imagery
- All-seeing eye
- Double-headed eagle
- Twin pillars (Sun/Moon)
- Obelisks, pyramids, checkerboards
- Esoteric stained glass or artwork
- Lodge-like altars

B. Language & Teachings

- Use of "The Great Architect"
- Avoidance of Christ's Lordship
- Universalism
- Secret wisdom / hidden light language
- Discouraging questions or discernment
- Avoidance of repentance or spiritual warfare

C. Leadership Behavior

- Known Freemasons in leadership
- Hidden affiliations
- Closed-door decisions
- Financial secrecy
- Lodge-style hierarchy
- A small controlling group

D. Church Culture

- Controlling or cold atmosphere
- Discouragement of prayer or deliverance
- Strong cliques
- Hostility toward concerns about Freemasonry
- Pressure not to question leadership

E. Spiritual Discernment

- Sense of spiritual heaviness
- Observed secrecy
- Holy Spirit prompting concern

2. Prayer for Protection and Clarity

Heavenly Father,
In the name of Jesus Christ, I ask for Your protection, wisdom, and clarity.
Expose anything hidden that does not honor You.
Guard my heart from fear, suspicion, and confusion.
Let every false light be extinguished and every deception uncovered.
Protect me and my family under the blood of Jesus.
I declare that Jesus Christ is Lord.
Amen.

3. Guide on Renouncing Freemasonry

STEP 1 — Understand the need for renunciation.
Freemasonry involves oaths, secrecy, and spiritual conflict with Christ.

STEP 2 — Break the oaths.
“In Jesus’ name, I renounce every oath, vow, and covenant of Freemasonry.”

STEP 3 — Renounce all degrees.
“I renounce all rituals, symbols, handshakes, penalties, and ceremonies.”

STEP 4 — Remove items.
Dispose of aprons, rings, regalia, books, or certificates.

STEP 5 — Close spiritual doors.
“Father, close every door opened through Freemasonry.”

STEP 6 — Affirm Christ’s Lordship.
Recommit to Scripture and transparency.

STEP 7 — Seek prayer support.
Invite a pastor or mature believer.

4. How to Speak to a Pastor or Family Member

- A. Prepare your heart with prayer.
- B. Start with questions, not accusations.
- C. Share concerns gently.
- D. Expect defensiveness; remain calm.
- E. Invite reflection; do not force.
- F. Set boundaries if hostility arises.
- G. Trust the Holy Spirit for the breakthrough.
